

Dear Parents/Carers,

Following the accident on Tuesday, our local councillor; Felicity Cunliffe-Lister has been in communication with myself, Highways, the Police and Parish Council. I have been informed that we now have an undertaking from Highways to install survey tubes to monitor traffic speed in the village. I have received confirmation today that the tubes will be installed on the 22<sup>nd</sup> June and will capture all speeds through the village.

This is the first step which must be taken before considering options such as a potential 20mph speed limit zones. Once this data has been collected, Highways have said that they will attend a meeting to discuss what calming measures can be installed.

I feel that it is important that we come together as a community to share our concerns and discuss the outcomes from the data survey. As soon as I have received this information from Highways, I would like to suggest that we hold a meeting at school to discuss these.
